Since 1944, Alberta has certified over 240,000 journeymen through its trades training and certification programs. Strict standards of excellence in trades training are developed through cooperation between government and industry so that excellence in workmanship is established and maintained.

This advanced system of apprenticeship and training is now available internationally.

We have the resources to train your apprentices in Alberta. They then return to your country for their on-the-job experience. In addition, we can customize our **apprenticeship delivery** system to meet your needs.

The Government of Alberta issues the **Alberta Journeyman Certificate**. In addition, the province administers the **Canada-wide Interprovincial Red Seal** program that provides cross-country mobility for journeymen that pass this special exam.

Industrial site delivery of specific apprenticeship programs is available.

Train-the-trainer courses are available to ensure that qualified people from your country can return and deliver the same courses as offered by Alberta instructors. Teaching techniques and course content are identical.

Curricula and learning materials are available for most trades and can be adapted to specific client needs.

Specialized consulting services are available to help you plan the most effective way to access Alberta apprenticeship training programs.

Accreditation arrangements can be identified and assessed to allow training delivery outside of Canada.

Technology trades training (two year institutional stream) is available and well established at selected post-secondary institutions.

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The trades listed are officially designated and supported by the Government of Alberta. Specific trade regulations are available which include length of program, entrance requirements and other pertinent information.

Alberta trade apprenticeship programs are on average four years in length. This includes an in-school training component each year.
