I hope you will like the skins, and that this lot will arrive without mishap; another of our shortages is the wooden packing case, so perhaps you would return any skins you can in the same box, and it can make other trans-Atlantic passages on our behalf If you think you would like any further specimens of f. Melanitta fusca fusca please let me know, in which case I will; see

if I can secure some in the early part of the New Year for you.

Do you also want adult female of Accipiter nisus nisus, can doubtless send you a specimen. By the way the females of this bird are
pleomorphic to a degree; I have very long series here, and shall
probably get more in time.

Barrow's Goldeneye for me; I should like this species in different plumages if at any time you have such to spare; have you a sufficiency of the nominate form; I have many more here than I can want, and consequently possess this bird in all the plumages it is met with in this country.
